WHY CHOOSE A BRITISH EDUCATION?

British Education remains highly-prized globally. According to the International Schools Council (ISC), over 4 and a half million students are currently in an English-medium school, with over 3,700 schools in 160 countries using elements of the UK national curriculum. This means that for many parents globally, a British Education is the best that you can get.

The powerful pull of a British Education has long been based in its reputation for academic excellence. This reputation is not without foundation; of current world leaders, 55 studied in the UK, while 38% of Nobel Prize winners were educated in the British System.

The rigour of the UK's education system remains its biggest attraction. The depth and richness of knowledge contained in the UK curriculum combined with exacting externally moderated examinations mean qualifications such as GCSEs, A-Levels, and the BTEC hold a global currency. Indeed, the UK system has long been seen as providing easier access to leading universities all around the world, due to the depth of knowledge required to achieve top grades in UK examinations.

Further to its reputation for academic excellence, a UK education appeals to parents who want their children to experience a rounded education. The British curriculum is a broad and balanced one, which values the arts, sports and a broad programme of extra-curricular activities, such as the highly respected Duke of Edinburgh Award, which encourages the development of the whole child fostering soft skills, risk-taking and developing individual passions. For parents who recognise their child will be working in a global, multilingual workplace, the development of such skills is just as important as academic results.

The depth, breadth and rigour of the UK curriculum is uniquely global, which is why a UK education remains highly prized.





INCLUSION

Community is central to a happy learning environment at school. At Kings', we strive to ensure that all our students feel a sense of belonging, as their happiness and progress in learning is vital to our value system.

Our inclusive admissions policy ensures that we are well resourced to meet the educational needs of students who require support in their learning and for those who need additional learning challenges.

Our Learning Inclusively at Kings' (LInK) team is formed by specialist teachers and Learning Support Assistants who can support students both inside and outside the classroom.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

At Kings', we have an ongoing focus on developing our students' values and appreciation of their social responsibility. SPORT

At Kings', we recognise the positive and transformational benefits that sport can bring to each student's development. The sports programme at Kings' has been developed to give our students the widest possible exposure to competitive and recreational sport in Dubai.

We offer sport to every student, not just at a competitive level, but as part of the curriculum, with every student receiving a minimum of two hours of Physical Education a week in addition to access to our Extra-Curricular Activities and Competitive Sports Programmes.

Our dedicated coaching and mentoring programmes also provide us with the ability to nurture top talent.

As full members of the Dubai Affiliated School Sport Association (DASSA), British Schools in the Middle East (BSME), and Council Of British International Schools (COBIS), we have access to the top international school sports competitions globally.

Kings' offers a wide breadth of activities including Football, Rugby, Netball, Basketball, Tennis, Cricket, Swimming and Athletics.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

Through studying the arts, students learn to understand critical and creative thinking processes, to develop their confidence and ability in artistic expression, and to gain a deeper awareness of historical and cultural context to different artistic disciplines.

Kings' students are able to engage in creative and expressive arts across all age groups, from our youngest artists right through to the study of Fine Art, Drama, Photography, and Music at A-level.

The Creative and Performing Arts programme is alive with talent and immeasurable enthusiasm. Our young dramatists explore techniques, themes and issues throughout the concept-based learning journey in class and within incredibly popular extra-curricular clubs.

These clubs evolve into production rehearsals as they gear up for community events and major productions in our purpose-built auditorium and Black Box Theatres.





PREPARATION FOR LIFE

Kings' aims to enable all its students to develop personally and socially so that by the time they leave at 18 years old, they will be ready to face the challenges of an ever-changing world.

We encourage student leadership. The house system at Kings' comprises four different house groups. It aims to enable students to develop a sense of identity aside from their year group. OUR CURRICULUM

At Kings' School Dubai, we follow the National Curriculum for England which we adapt to ensure a conceptual, integrated and enriched learning experience for our young learners. It is important that we contextualise the curriculum so that students understand what they are learning and why, by using the environment around them.

Students love learning about things they love, so allowing them ownership over their learning, where appropriate, is critical to their success.

Students are given many opportunities in a range of environments to support their growth and

development. This includes academic, sport (both competitive and non-competitive), performance and creative arts, as well as personal challenge and discovery activities, such as residential experiences outside the classroom. It is our role as educators to ensure such opportunities exist that will engage and challenge our students.

We also believe that everyone in school should be a role model to others, right from the youngest members of our community. Respect for each other, our learning, our community and our environment is essential.

FOUNDATION STAGE

At Kings' School Dubai, we follow the British Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum, which revolves around the seven areas of learning: Personal, Social and Emotional Development; Physical Development; Communication and Language; Literacy; Mathematics; Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. We teach this through a play-based curriculum where students initiate their own ideas and take responsibility for their learning.

We believe that young students learn the skills and knowledge they need for life through play. When students direct their own learning, they figure out things for themselves, take calculated risks and find innovative ways to think about the world and how it works. Students learn to overcome obstacles, solve problems, communicate their needs and feelings effectively and work with those who may have different ideas and points

of view. The students also experience the joy of self-discovery and the thrill of being able to pursue their own creative ideas.

At Kings' School Dubai, we are especially proud of the environments we have created, which encourage investigation and exploration to take place. Students use these different spaces to build on their ideas and experiences. Our resources are open ended, reflect real life and are organised to enable students to access them independently.

Our teachers and learning assistants are highly skilled at facilitating the student's learning through observing, questioning and playing alongside, and with the students. Working in this way, the adults are able to gain an accurate picture and can therefore plan their next steps effectively. Students are also given the time and space to reflect on their learning, which supports the students in thinking of new ideas and ways to improve.





PRIMARY SCHOOL

At Kings' School Dubai, our unique, bespoke curriculum is constantly evolving to reflect the dynamic world that we live in. It is based on the National Curriculum for England, to ensure that the skills and knowledge gained are in line with UK expectations yet is enhanced further by the addition of carefully selected concepts in each year group that enable children to question, discuss and synthesize information at a deeper level.

Our concept-based curriculum is skilfully designed to continuously reflect the specific needs and varied interests of our children, making it truly diverse and inclusive. Exciting hooks engage our learners, and the involvement of our children in deciding what they want to learn and how, ensures greater personalisation and motivates them through empowerment.

Every learning opportunity is thoughtfully planned to make learning accessible, purposeful, and contextualised. Cross-curricular and integrated learning experiences develop transferable skills

and understanding. These learning experiences are designed to: develop critical-thinking skills; nurture risk-taking; stimulate the imagination; build confidence; provide opportunities for mastery; and develop leadership skills.

We encourage learning to be taken beyond the limits of the classroom. Our amazing facilities, warm community, inspiring local culture and places of interest in the local area provide exciting and authentic opportunities for enrichment. Specialist teachers in Physical Education and Swimming, Modern Foreign Languages and Arabic, Islamic Education, Creative and Performing Arts, Music and Computing further enrich and enhance the curriculum through weekly taught sessions providing opportunities for depth and mastery at every level.

Children at Kings' School Dubai experience a rich learning environment, filled with exciting challenges, creative hooks and memorable experiences, all designed to empower and inspire a lifelong love of learning.

KEY STAGE ONE

Years 1 and 2 - Children aged 5 to 7

Key Stage One is designed to support students as they transition from play-based learning in the Foundation Stage to a more formalised learning environment and setting.

At Kings' School Dubai, our curriculum is planned using an overarching concept, providing students with meaningful real life contexts. Effective cross-curricular planning underpins lessons that are carefully designed, allowing knowledge and skills to be interwoven across many different subject areas.

Every day, students are given the opportunity to solve problems, make connections, be creative, work with others and self manage, resulting in independent and resilient students. Imaginative and engaging activities, linked to the objectives from the National Curriculum, are planned around the student's interests, this in turn leads to high levels of engagement and motivation.

As the students progress through Key Stage One, their enquiring minds are further developed through collaborative tasks, critical thinking activities and personalised learning, affording them the skills to become effective learners.

Class teachers deliver outstanding lessons and facilitate learning in English, Mathematics, UAE Social Science, Phonics, Moral Education (Year 2), History, Geography, Science and Computing.

KEY STAGE TWO

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 - Children aged 7 to 11

Key Stage Two has a greater academic emphasis whilst continuing to nurture and guide students to excellence. Leadership and collaboration skills are developed to ensure that students can start to take responsibility for their own learning and build positive relationships with their peers.

Learning is planned through our bespoke conceptbased curriculum which allows students to develop connections and challenge their thinking across English, Mathematics, Science, History, Design and Technology, Computing, and Geography. Moral Education and UAE Social Studies are at the forefront of our teaching, enabling the students to enhance their knowledge of local history and culture, whilst understanding the importance of becoming moral citizens.

This experience is further supported by specialist teachers/learning spaces for Arabic, Islamic, Music, Art, PE, Swimming, French and Spanish (Years 5&6).

OUR CURRICULUM

At Kings' School Nad Al Sheba, students are equipped and prepared for lifelong learning through our thematic, cross-curricular approaches and the incorporation of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) to bring learning to life. As a result, students become enthusiastic, independent and motivated learners with the ability to adapt and solve problems.

Our unique curriculum is based on the Early Years Foundation Stage, followed by the British National Curriculum in the primary years. Our specialist teachers of Arabic, French and Spanish, Creative and Performing Arts, Music, Physical Education and Swimming are experts in their field, and ensure that teaching is of an exceptionally high standard.

Subject leaders take a collaborative approach to planning our unique curriculum, ensuring that our multidisciplinary approach explores local, as well as global issues. The themes of the moral and social education programme are carefully woven through all areas of the curriculum, providing opportunities to discuss, debate and reflect.

Communication and language skills lie at the heart of successful learners. We instil this through a range of enhancements beyond the curriculum, such as our drama and performing arts programme, our Debate Club and Kings' Scholars Cup.

We recognise that personalised learning, and the individual needs and interests of all the students, are central to academic success, driven by ambition and engagement.

Our core values, and the uncompromising approach to ensuring The Best by Every Child, shines through in all that we do here at Kings' School Nad Al Sheba.

ARABIC ACADEMY

Our Arabic Academy enables all students to excel in three core aspects of this enriching facility within the school.

Our Arabic Academy is an optional, after-school programme, open to all students in Years 1 and above, which focuses on three strands:

Arabic Language; for native, and non-native speakers, our Arabic teachers offer after-school 'masterclasses', with the opportunity to practice Arabic language skills in new and exciting ways.

Islamic Studies; additional opportunities for our students to explore faith, using core values. These sessions are led by our Islamic Studies teachers and link to the art and culture themes, for example, calligraphy is used as a theme to explore art, culture, language and faith.

Art and Culture; Each and every student who participates in our Arabic Academy spends time studying the art and culture of this unique corner of the world, meeting artists who will inspire their creativity and give creative insights into some of the expressive art forms that are in abundance in the United Arab Emirates.

These include; photography, calligraphy, pottery, weaving, leatherwork, textiles and craft work.





NURSERY

At Kings', we do things differently and our talented nursery team is no exception, tailoring the British Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum to provide a personalised, child-led learning experience for each and every child in our care, helping them to lay the foundations for a successful future.

Our teachers plan and provide effective learning opportunities for children from the age of two, centred on playing and exploring, active learning, and creative and critical thinking. Everything we do is based around developing unique children who have individual learning characteristics.

We know that children learn best when they are having fun and when they feel safe and secure. Through our play-based and explorative environments, which extend and challenge their learning, children grow at their own pace, guided by highly qualified professionals.

Children develop their curiosity, communication and language skills, think scientifically, fine-tune their motor skills, enjoy stories, sing, dance, draw, flourish creatively, and develop their physical abilities through hands-on and meaningful learning experiences, all of which relate to real life.

Delivering the British curriculum within the unique context of the UAE enables us to embrace and celebrate Islamic values and awareness for Emirati culture in a developmentally appropriate way, so that the children learn about the country in which they live.



FUTURE FOUNDATIONS

At Kings' Nursery Nad Al Sheba, we lay the first foundations for future academic success within the Kings' family.

During their earliest years, children form attitudes about learning that will last a lifetime. Children who receive the right support and encouragement during their nursery years will be creative and adventurous learners throughout their lives.

Our role as educators is to prepare the children in our care for a world of possible careers, some of which may not even exist yet. They each have the potential to become future doctors, politicians, artists, authors, athletes, dentists, ecologists, chefs, accountants, scientists, astronauts, teachers, botanists. There are no limits to what they can dream and achieve.

The way we teach our children ensures that, whichever path they wish to take in the future, their foundations will be secure. We encourage them to be highly involved, motivated and focussed individuals who go on to become little leaders of their own learning.

FOUNDATION STAGE

We follow the British Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum, which is centered around seven areas of learning. Learning begins with the three prime areas; Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Communication and Language.

Then, when developmentally appropriate, students progress into learning within the four specific areas; Literacy, Mathematics, Expressive Arts and Design and Understanding the World.

We teach skills and understanding through a play-based interest-led curriculum, with students passions and curiosities leading their learning journey. Our guiding principles within the Early Years are:

- All students are unique
- There is goodness and compassion in every child
- Children are curious, creative, natural inquirers and are motivated by their own interests
- Children learn through exploration and play
- Children are resilient learners who understand mistakes are part of the learning process
- Teachers and children guide and facilitate the learning, co-constructing their knowledge together
- Relationships are fundamental

Children in the Foundation Stage are taught predominantly by their class teacher then have their experience enriched through weekly Physical Education, Swimming and Arabic sessions.





PRIMARY SCHOOL

Our primary school curriculum is designed to build on the excellent outcomes of our students in the seven areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum. Transition between the EYFS curriculum and between primary and secondary education is tailored in order for the children to grow and develop and reach their potential.

Subjects include English Language and Literature, Mathematics, Science, Design and Technology, Computing, History, Geography, Creative and Performing Arts; including Music, Dance and Drama, Physical Education and Swimming, French and Arabic.

Cross-curricular opportunities are culturally sensitive, celebrating the diversity within our school as well as developing a stronger understanding of local heritage.

At Kings' School Nad Al Sheba, we offer an environment for students to acquire and develop skills, knowledge and understanding that they will need for a successful transition to secondary school.

We value not only academic development, but also the social, emotional, creative and physical development of each student's during these crucial years.

Our comprehensive and dedicated programme for more exceptionally able students is offered to all students to ensure each student's individual needs are met. The programme has a clear identification, progression, and opportunities pathway that ensures students continue to excel and also extend their areas of strength.

KEY STAGE ONE

Change to Years 1 and 2 - Ages 5 to 7

Key Stage One represents the first two years of the primary phase, for students aged five to seven years old. During this important developmental stage, students will be taught an enriched National Curriculum programme, drawing upon best practice from across the world. Children learn three core languages from Year 1; English, Arabic and French.

KEY STAGE TWO

Change to Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 - Ages 7 to 11

The Key Stage Two curriculum extends across Years 3 to 6 and builds upon a student's achievements and progress through Key Stage One. Our students will be encouraged to take greater responsibility for their

own learning. In addition to the three core languages taught in Key Stage One, this is extended to include Spanish in Upper Key Stage 2.



SECONDARY SCHOOL

Designed for the future, Kings' School Nad Al Sheba's Secondary School curriculum takes the best of both worlds, in combining the very best teachers, with a wealth of experience of teaching through Key Stages 3 and 4, and enhancing this with best practice from our international community.

The Key Stage Three curriculum, based on the English National Curriculum, is an exclusive partnership between Kings' and Cambridge Education. It builds on primary attainments and achievements, where we aim to achieve the highest levels of engagement and excitement through student-led learning initiatives, which capture students interests and drive their ambitions. Cambridge Education is held in high-esteem around the world.

Acknowledged for its high academic standards and its well-rounded approach to education, the curriculum provides students with transferability and the opportunity to gain access to reputable universities, worldwide.

KEY STAGE THREE

Years 7, 8 and 9 - Ages 11 to 14

Our highly trained, and passionate teachers, hand-picked from the United Kingdom, come with a wealth of experience of teaching in Key Stage Three, and with a proven track record.

Our specialist team delivers the English National Curriculum for Key Stage Three, a broad and balanced curriculum that provides students with essential knowledge and skills across a range of subjects.

All students at Key Stage Three study English, Arabic, Mathematics, Science (combined), Global Perspectives, History, Geography, Art, Design, Technology, Creative and Performing Arts, Music, Moral, Social and Cultural Studies, Islamic Education (for Muslim students), Physical Education, along with French or Spanish as additional language studies.

KEY STAGE FOUR

Years 10 and 11 - Ages 14 to 16

Key Stage Four requires our students to study a number of compulsory and optional subjects in greater depth, leading to GCSE qualifications at the end of Year 11. Seven core subjects will be studied and examined: English, Arabic, Mathematics,

Science (combined, a dual award), PE and Global Perspectives. Three additional subjects are then chosen from the following options; one STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), one subject form the Arts, and one from Humanities.

OUR CURRICULUM

At Kings' School Al Barsha, every day is a step along a life-long learning journey. We design opportunities to inspire students to become effective, enthusiastic, independent and motivated learners.

Our unique curriculum is based on the National Curriculum for England and the Early Years Foundation Stage. These world-class curricula are influenced by current issues, local opportunities and the specific needs and interests of our children.

Teaching takes a cross-curricular, interdisciplinary approach, carefully designed to immerse students in their learning, inspiring them to make connections in authentic contexts. There is a clear emphasis on teaching skills and students are challenged to

progress in all ways and at all levels. Students are inspired to achieve more than they ever thought possible through exciting hands-on learning experiences, imaginative teaching and community partnerships.

The curriculum delivery is enriched by specialist teachers of French, Spanish, Arabic, Physical Education, ICT, Swimming, Music, Islamic Education and The Creative and Performing Arts.

Our learning is underpinned by our shared language of learning, centred around seven learning dispositions: collaboration, resilience, communication, risk taking, creativity, curiosity and responsibility.

FOUNDATION STAGE

In Foundation Stage, we follow the British Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum, which is centred around seven areas of learning: Personal, Social and Emotional Development; Physical Development; Communication and Language; Literacy; Mathematics; Expressive Arts and Design; Understanding the World. We teach skills and understanding through an interest-led curriculum, with student's passions and curiosities leading their learning journey.

Students in the Foundation Stage are taught predominantly by their class teacher, and their experience is enriched through weekly Music, Physical Education, Swimming and Arabic sessions led by Specialist Teachers.

Our guiding principles within the Early Years are:

- All children are unique
- There is goodness and compassion in every child
- Children are curious, creative, natural inquirers and are motivated by their own interests
- Children learn through exploration and play
- Children are resilient learners who understand mistakes are part of the learning process
- Teachers and children guide and facilitate the learning, co-constructing their knowledge together
- Relationships are fundamental





PRIMARY SCHOOL

Throughout the primary curriculum, learning is built on tailoring our student's experiences so that their provision develops the outcomes of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum and leads naturally into a secondary school context.

Our curriculum follows a concept-based approach, enabling students to immerse themselves in their learning, making connections to real world experiences. KEY STAGE ONE

Years 1 and 2 - Ages 5 to 7

Key Stage One is designed to sensitively support students as they transition from the play-based Foundation Stage to a more formalised learning environment. Shared central areas follow the student's interests, and imaginative and engaging activities lead to high levels of engagement and excitement.

As the students mature, we encourage greater independence and opportunities to learn through collaboration.

Learning is class-based and units of work are planned to integrate and interlink knowledge and skills from a variety of subjects into meaningful real-life contexts. The Class Teacher delivers English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Moral Education, History, and Geography.

This is then further enhanced by Specialist Teachers across a wealth of subject areas including Music, Art, Design Technology, Arabic, French, Islamic Studies, Physical Education and Swimming.

KEY STAGE TWO

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 - Ages 7 to 11

Key Stage Two has a greater academic emphasis, while also building on citizenship and key personal development areas. Learning in subject areas is complemented by skill acquisition in; independence, leadership, thinking skills, collaboration, imagination and confidence building.

Cross-curricular opportunities are carefully crafted to draw on our local context while seamlessly linking

skills from class-based subjects so that connections can be made. Class Teachers facilitate learning in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Moral Education, History and Geography.

This is then further enhanced by specialist teachers for Music, Drama, Art, Design Technology, Computing, Arabic, French, Spanish, Islamic Studies, Physical Education and Swimming.

SECONDARY SCHOOL

Built on the English National Curriculum, Kings' School Al Barsha's Secondary School curriculum is enhanced by best practice from our international context.

The Key Stage Three curriculum builds on primary attainments and achievements, where we maintain

high levels of engagement and excitement through student-led learning initiatives while also preparing students for the challenges of Key Stage Four and Five.



KEY STAGE THREE

Years 7, 8 and 9 - Ages 11 to 14

Highly trained specialist staff from the United Kingdom deliver the English National Curriculum for Key Stage Three.

This is a broad and balanced curriculum that provides students with essential knowledge and skills across a range of subjects.

All students at Key Stage Three study English, Mathematics, Science, Computer Science, History, Geography, Art, Design, Technology, Drama, Music, Physical Education, Islamic Education (for Muslim students) Arabic, Spanish or French as discrete disciplines.

KEY STAGE FOUR

Years 10 and 11 - Ages 14 to 16

Key Stage Four requires our students to study a number of compulsory and optional subjects in greater depth, leading to GCSE qualifications at the end of Year 11.

All four core subjects are studied and examined: English Language; English Literature; Mathematics; and Science.

Four additional subjects are chosen from the following options: Business Studies, Economics, Computing, Design Technology, Physical Education, Combined Science, Psychology, History, Geography, Triple Science (Chemistry, Biology, Physics), Further Mathematics (for selected students only), ICT, Food Preparation and Nutrition, Art, Dance, Music, Photography, Drama, Textiles, French, Spanish and Arabic.

All students continue to participate in PSCHE, Physical Education, Islamic Education (for Muslims), Skills Curriculum, and Independent Study as part of their non-examined curriculum.



SIXTH FORM

Years 12 and 13 - Ages 16 to 18

The Sixth Form is accommodated within the Kings' School Al Barsha Secondary School building, and is centred around the purpose-built Sixth Form common room, which acts as a focus for the students' school life.

The Sixth Form team provides friendly and consistent support, helping the students balance their academic, extra-curricular and social lives and preparing them for the independent challenges of life after Kings'. Sixth Form students can choose to follow the A-Level or BTEC programme.

All sixth form students are also encouraged to embark upon other education opportunities that are available.

These include the Duke of Edinburgh Award, lectures, leadership opportunities, work experience and the EPQ (Extended Project Qualification), where students can write an interdisciplinary extended essay on a subject of their choice, and are assessed in a programme of collaboration, critical thinking, leadership, emotional intelligence, and enquiry.

A-LEVEL

Those who opt to take the A-Level route may choose up to four subjects to study in Year 12.

A-Level subjects are taught as a linear course, with all examinations taking place at the end of Year 13. Students continue with at least three subjects throughout Year 13.

Students are encouraged to embark upon the EPQ (Extended Project Qualification) and the Duke of Edinburgh Award, alongside their A-Level courses.

BTEC DIPLOMA

Students who wish to study a BTEC diploma will be able to choose from Business Studies Level 2 and 3, or BTEC Sport, BTEC Hospitality and BTEC Performing Arts at Level 3, or a combination.

In some cases, students may combine BTEC and A-Level qualifications. Students complete work experience as part of the BTEC programme.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students are expected to achieve a minimum of 6 C grades or above in full course linear GCSEs, with a minimum grade C in Maths and English and an A or A* in subjects they are choosing to study at A-Level is preferred.

In the numeric grading system, students are required to achieve a minimum of 6 GCSEs at 5 or higher with a 7, 8 or 9 being preferred in the subjects they are choosing to study at A-Level.

An A or A* under the lettered grading model at GCSE or IGCSE, or a 7, 8 or 9 in the numeric grading system, should be achieved in a closely related subject when a subject has not been studied at GCSE.

External applicants or students from non-UK curriculum schools will also be required to sit assessments.

FOUNDATION STAGE FS1 & FS2

The route for children who wish to join the Foundation Stages in Kings' School Dubai, Kings' School Al Barsha and Kings' School Nad Al Sheba.

Registrations are made online. Full details of deadlines etc are on the school website. Children are invited for a play- based assessment.

Children take part in a group assessment, and/or a one-to-one assessment, as required.

Assessments last approximately 30 minutes

School reports will be requested from current nurseries or schools if applicable.

Supporting material (e.g. details of learning needs, medical conditions, etc) should be submitted at the same time as the application entry form.

PRIMARY SCHOOL YEARS 1 TO 3

The route for students who wish to join the primary school at Kings' School Dubai, Kings' School Al Barsha, and Kings' School Nad Al Sheba.

Registrations are made online. Full details of deadlines etc are on the school website. Children are invited to take part in a one-to-one teacher-led assessment with a member of the Primary Leadership Team.

All students will sit an academic assessment in English, Mathematics and Phonics.

The assessment will determine the student's school readiness for the Kings' educational programme, including any language and/or special educational needs support.

All our assessments are conducted in English.

School reports are required from current schools.

Supporting material (e.g. details of learning needs, medical conditions, etc) should be submitted at the same time as the applicationt entry form.

PRIMARY SCHOOL YEARS 4 TO 6

The route for all students who wish to join the primary school at Kings' School Dubai, Kings' School Al Barsha, and Kings' School Nad Al Sheba.

Registrations are made online. Full details of deadlines etc are on the school website. Students are invited to take the CAT4 (Cognitive Ability Test), consisting of 4 sections - Verbal / Non-Verbal / Quantitative / Spatial. The test will take approximately 2 hours.

All students will also sit an academic assessment in English, which will be a 30 minute writing task.

All our assessments are conducted in English.

School reports for the previous two years are required from current schools.

Supporting material (e.g. details of learning needs, medical conditions, etc) should be submitted at the same time as the assessment entry form.

SECONDARY SCHOOL YEARS 7 TO 10

The route for girls and boys who wish to join Kings' Secondary School pre-GCSE.

Admissions are not open to Year 11, as this is a GCSE examinations year.

Registrations are made online. Full details of deadlines etc are on the school website. Students are invited to take the CAT4 (Cognitive Ability test), consisting of 4 sections - Verbal / Non-Verbal / Quantitative / Spatial. The test will take approximately 1.5 hours

All students will also sit an academic assessment in English, which will be a 30 minute writing task.

All our assessments are conducted in English.

References and supporting material, including school reports for the last two years, will be required from current schools.

We look at these carefully, along with the end of Year 5 report (Year 7 entry only) and other supporting material (e.g. details of any learning needs, medical conditions etc).

SIXTH FORM YEAR 12

The route for girls and boys who wish to join Kings' for the Sixth Form (A-Level and BTEC). Places are only available at our Kings' School Al Barsha campus.

Registrations are made online. Full details of deadlines etc are on the school website. At this stage, a candidate's potential is assessed on their predicted GCSE performance. Internal candidates do not have to sit a separate entry assessment for Sixth Form, however, each subject has a minimum expected grade.

External candidates will sit an entry assessment for Sixth Form.

Where GCSE results are not available, candidates will be required to sit multiple assessments.

A confidential reference and predicted/ achieved grades at GCSE will be required from current schools upon application.

We also look at the last three years of school reports, and any other supporting material (e.g. details of any learning needs, medical conditions etc).

- Admission Fee 500 AED +VAT to be paid online. This includes those transferring from other Kings' schools
- Leaving Letter/Certificate from current school if coming from outside of Dubai

Which curriculum is taught in Kings' schools?

At Kings', we follow the English National Curriculum, which is organised in sections called 'Key Stages'.

What is the age cut-off?

As per directive from KHDA, Kings' has implemented the 31st August cut-off date for Foundation Stage 1 to Year 2 applicants. For Year 3 and above, placement will be based on your child's assessment result and transfer/leaving certificate from the previous school.

How can I request my child's assessment feedback?

You can request to receive feedback from your child's assessment by asking a member of the Admissions Team to schedule an appointment with the appropriate academic team member.

What if my child is unsuccessful in the assessment?

In the event your child does not meet the Kings' entry requirements, a re-assessment may be arranged if appropriate.
